

Accelerated Transfer BSN

Brenau's Accelerated Transfer BSN program is designed for those with some prior education. The program is open to students who have completed 60 credit hours or an associate or bachelor's degree in a non-nursing field. The Accelerated Transfer BSN provides the education, training and personal support necessary to sit for the NCLEX exam and gain initial licensure as a registered nurse (RN).

Admission Qualifications

- If you have completed 60 transferable credits or more, you may meet the minimum education requirement to enroll in the Accelerated Transfer BSN program.
- Recommended cumulative GPA 3.0 or greater (*based on all college coursework*). Graduate coursework GPA will be considered if the student has earned a graduate degree.
- Recommended science GPA 3.0 or greater (based on cumulative grades over the last 10-years in the following courses. If the course or its equivalent was not taken within the last 10 years, the most recent grade [up to 15-years old] will be considered):
 - o Anatomy and Physiology, I with Lab (BY209/BY209L) or equivalent
 - o Anatomy and Physiology II with Lab (BY210/BY210L) or equivalent
 - o Microbiology with Lab (BY206/BY206L) or equivalent
 - Principles of Chemistry I & II w/Lab or equivalent*

*Possible chemistry substitution after official transcript review, please discuss with your admissions representative.

- One of the following:
 - Associate's degree from a regionally accredited school (or foreign equivalent). Degrees from schools outside of the U.S. must be evaluated by a NACES accredited transcript review agency.
 - Completion of liberal education coursework as outlined in the Brenau Undergraduate Catalog.
- All prerequisite coursework completed prior to starting the program
- Admission Exam (HESI) Minimum score of 75%. The HESI A2 Admission Exam:
 - Must be taken at the Norcross campus. Exams taken at other schools are not accepted.
 - Scores are good for one calendar year.
 - May be taken twice in a calendar year with a 30-day waiting period between exams.
- Attributes and experiences that indicate initiative, commitment, caring, and a strong interest in improving health for patients, families, and communities.
- Satisfactory background check and drug screen.
